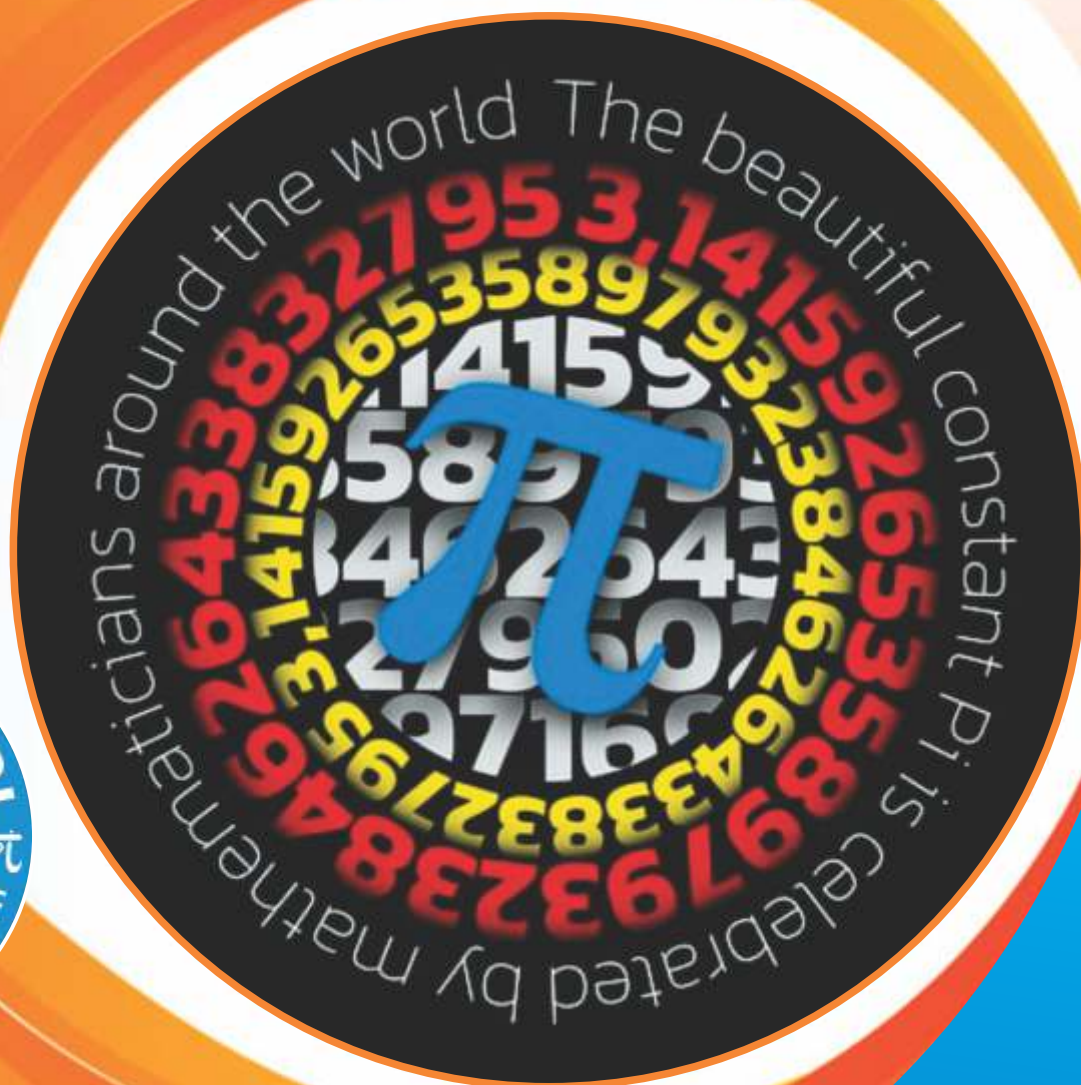

## OUR SCHOOL AIMS

At The Pi School every child matters and as such we have high expectations of all members of our school community. We will provide a calm, safe, stimulating and challenging environment where children and adults develop an enjoyment of learning. We work together to:-

At the heart of these aims is a complete commitment by Pi to a policy of equal opportunities for all; regardless of class, disability, ethnic origin, gender, sexuality, family make-up, belief (religious or non-religious), or any other individual special need.

## ETHOS AND VALUES OF THE SCHOOL

The purpose and aim of our school is to ensure that we educate children so that they achieve their potential academically, socially, emotionally, physically and morally, through a broad and balanced whole school experience. We provide a stimulating, caring and safe environment, designed to enable all children to further their independence, equipping them for the next stage in their development. We assist children to develop a positive attitude towards themselves and to be tolerant and show respect towards other people, their beliefs and possessions. All members of the school community (teaching and non-teaching staff, parents, pupils and management) work towards the school's aims by



working as a team, in harmony with the school's aims and supporting and encouraging one another. We try to adopt a positive attitude on life, be good role models and provide equal opportunities for all our pupils.

## **ADMISSION OF STUDENTS**

1. The Principal is wholly responsible for admission. He is the final authority to admit children in the school keeping in mind the available seats and the ideals of the school.
2. Nobody has any claim for admission and the Principal's decision which is final cannot be disputed nor can be taken to any law courts.
3. Admission to Nursery takes place every year and the Principal admits the students in the best way he thinks fit, according to his discretion.
4. Immediate neighbours and local children may be given some consideration for admission.

## **EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION**

1. Two Unit Tests and Two Semester Examinations will be held in an academic year. However it is left to the discretion of the principal to conduct other tests and examinations.
2. It is compulsory for all students to be present for all the tests and examinations.
3. If a student fails to attend a test /examination ,without any prior permission he/she may lose 20 percent of the total marks of the final examination and may even be asked to repeat the class.
4. Medical certificates, in case of sickness, must be submitted while the examination is in progress or soon after the examination. Otherwise such certificates will not be considered.
5. A student must get 50 percent marks in all subjects to get a pass.
6. No student will be allowed to sit in class more than two years.
7. A student who gets less than 25 % marks in the final examination will be withdrawn from the school.

## **ATTENDANCE**

1. Regular attendance is stressed in the school.
2. A student who is absent for more than 10% days without any information will not be allowed to write examination and will not be promoted.
3. A student who is not regular in attending the classes will be asked to leave the school.

4. A student who is absent, on his/her return, must bring a letter explaining the absence signed by one of his/her parents and the absence should be noted in the school diary too.
5. If a person is absent for more than three days he/she must submit a medical certificate along with the leave letter.
6. Leave will not be granted for festivals and for visit to relatives, for marriages of relatives and medical check-ups, unless they are very urgent.

## EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Children will have the opportunity to take part in extra-curricular activities which vary during the year to provide a range of opportunities. They will take place during lunch times and two periods on Saturday reserves for extra-curricular activities.

## WITHDRAWAL AND DISMISSAL

A month's notice is required prior to the withdrawal of a pupil, or fees for that month will be charged. The School reserves the right to dismiss pupils whose progress in studies is unsatisfactory, Honesty, cleanliness, neatness of person and dress, good manners, loyalty and respect for seniors are demanded and anyone not conforming to the school's ideals in these matters may be asked to leave. Immorality or grave insubordination and contempt of authority are always reason for dismissal.

## ANTI-BULLYING

We are fortunate not to have experienced many problems with bullying, but we do take a serious view on this matter. Parents will always be informed of any bullying issues. We rely on parents to inform us as early as possible if they ever have a concern with regard to bullying. We take a very proactive approach to this issue and like to deal with bullying on the first day it occurs wherever possible.

## WORKING HOURS

The school assembly begins at 7.55 am. Students are expected to attend the school assembly. Students not present in the school assembly will not be allowed to attend classes.

Classes are held from 8 am to 12 30 pm with a break of 30 minutes (10.40 to 11.10). There will be 6 periods of 40 minutes duration.

Nursery will have classes from 7.55 am to 10.40 am. There will be 4 periods of 40 minutes duration.

## THE SCHOOL UNIFORM

1. School uniform consist of morpeach green with navy blue shirt, green pants, white socks, black shoes(ordinary) and tie. Green skirts, worn by girls, must be long enough to be below the knees. Girls can wear green leggings with skirt.
2. During cold season, coats if they are worn, are to be solid green, sweaters with sleeves to be green.
3. Discoloured uniforms are not allowed.
